- **Democratic Family**
 - Family in which authority and responsibilities are shared equally by members
- **Divorce rate**
 - Number of divorces per 100 marriages per year
- **Extended Family**
 - Family unit composed of three generations that may or may not be living together in the same household
- **Nuclear Family**
 - Family unit consisting of husband, wife, and at least one child living in the same household
- **Single-Parent Family**
 - Family Unit headed by only one parent
- **Traditional Family**
 - Family in which roles, responsibilities, and behaviour tend to reflect patterns that have been passed along from one generation to another
- **Blended Family**
 - Family in which one or possibly both parents have been married before and have children from that marriage living with them.
